



This book presents articles on the background of the conflicts in South Caucasus. It provides resources for dialogue and cooperation. It is envisioned to contribute to starting a new phase in the history of South Caucasus: the rebuilding of trust.

The publication is unique in its collection of different opinions of authors from the South Caucasus countries and other regions. At the same time, the authors have a common goal – to restore trust between the peoples in the region and to promote reconciliation and peacebuilding.

The Coalition for Rebuilding Trust was established in the South Caucasus in 2015 and unifies civil society organizations from three UN member states – Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia – as well as the non-recognized states Abkhazia, South Ossetia and Nagorno-Karabakh.

The book contains very interesting material on trust-building processes after bloody conflicts in different countries. The hope is that various mechanisms of transitional justice, public dialogue and other peacebuilding measures could help overcome the heritage of the conflicts in the South Caucasus.
